To Lake County Sheriff Mark Curran,

My family and I wanted to write you in regard to what we feel is exemplary service by one of your officers, Kevin McHugh. On November 26th of this year, while doing some last minute Thanksgiving grocery shopping at Sunset in Long Grove I began having symptoms that, at the time, I thought was a heart attack. Within moments I knew I needed help, so with myself and my three young daughters parked in our van, I called 911. Kevin McHugh was the police officer who responded to my call. I was quickly taken away by ambulance, but my terrified children were left behind to wait for their dad with two great firefighters and Officer McHugh.

When the emergency team arrived, I was struggling to remain conscious and I am sure my daughters were quite frantic. They are only 5, 7 and 8 years old. The reason this story comes to you is because of Officer McHugh's response to these little girls, which I find to be an extraordinary testimony of a compassionate and committed police officer. He stayed with the girls for most of the time they were waiting for their dad. They tell me that, while he was with them, he sang songs with them, he played games with them, he told them stories, etc... All of the things a little girl needs to take her mind off of the fears of the moment and allow her to feel things were going to be okay.

Though I did not meet him, I am so very grateful that Kevin McHugh responded to my call that day. Because of his sensitivity to their needs in that moment, my girls told me about their wait in the van with smiles on their faces, rather than stories of how scared they were. No doubt, the fear was there, but we have always taught our girls that a policeman's most important job is to keep people safe and that is exactly what Officer McHugh did for our girls. He helped to calm them and made them feel that they were safe with him there.

It is a blessing to know that he and other officers like him are watching over our community, so we wanted to take a moment in this season of thankfulness to express our gratitude for the service Kevin McHugh and his fellow officers provide. We pray all the best for you in the coming year.
