**Ordinance Approving Amendments To Liquor Code For
Class “O” Taproom Liquor License
(Buffalo Creek Brewery)**

**VILLAGE OF LONG GROVE
ORDINANCE NO. 2016-O-___**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE LONG GROVE
VILLAGE CODE REGARDING LIQUOR LICENSES**

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Illinois Liquor Control Act, 235 ILCS 5/1-1 *et seq.*, the Village has the authority to license and regulate the retail sale of alcoholic beverages in the Village; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 2 of Title 3 of the Long Grove Village Code, the Village has adopted liquor licensing regulations for the sale of alcoholic beverages in the Village; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees have determined that it is in the best interests of the Village and its residents to amend the Long Grove Village Code, as set forth herein, to modify the regulations that apply to brewery taproom facilities;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Long Grove, County of Lake, State of Illinois, as follows:

SECTION ONE. **Recitals.** The foregoing recitals are incorporated into this Ordinance as findings of the President and Board of Trustees.

SECTION TWO. **Amendment.** Subsection (O), entitled "Class O Taproom," of Section 3-2-5, entitled "License Classification; Number; Fees;" of Chapter 2, entitled "Liquor Control Regulations," of Title 3, entitled "Business Regulations," of the Long Grove Village Code shall be, and it is hereby, amended in its entirety, so that Section 3-2-5(O) shall hereafter be and read as follows:

3-2-5 LICENSE CLASSIFICATIONS; NUMBER; FEES: The classification of licenses shall be as follows:

(O) Class O Taproom:

1. Classification: Class O licenses shall authorize the operation of a taproom on the same premises, and under the same ownership, as a brewery or craft brewery (including storage facilities therefor) operated in compliance with state and federal licenses authorizing the manufacturing, storage, distribution, and sale of alcoholic beverages. A Class O license shall authorize the following at a taproom:
 - a. Retail sale of beer produced on the premises at a bar or table for on-premises consumption;
 - b. Retail sale of beer produced on the premises in its original, sealed package for off-premises consumption, provided that such beer shall be sold only in packs of not less than four cans or bottles, which packs may contain different varieties of beer;
 - c. Retail sale of beer produced on the premises in growlers, **howlers, and kegs** for off-premises consumption, provided that such growlers **and howlers** contain not less than 32 fluid ounces, nor more than 68 fluid ounces, **and kegs contain not more than 15.5 gallons**, and are properly sealed for transport in compliance with state and federal law; and
 - d. Beer tastings of beer produced on the premises, provided that:
 - i. ~~The beer tastings occur as part of a brewery tour on the premises; and~~
 - ii. ~~t~~The beer tastings comply with all applicable state and federal laws and, in any event, do not exceed five samples of ~~three~~ **four** fluid ounces each per prospective purchaser per day.
2. The retail portion of the Class O licensed establishment, including beer tastings, shall be closed from two o'clock (2:00) a.m. through nine o'clock (9:00) a.m., during which times no alcoholic liquor shall be sold, or offered for sale or tasting, on the premises.
3. Number: 1
4. Fee: \$2,750.00

SECTION THREE. **Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form in the manner provided by law.
