


**1. Indian Creek Stream Improvement at Longview Meadow.** An application was submitted by the Long Grove Park District. **The estimated project cost is \$30,000 of which \$16,500 is the applicant's share and \$14,000 is being requested from the WMB, with 8 SMC in-kind hours.** The proposed project scope includes remediation of 21 logjams within Indian Creek on 2-3 properties in Long Grove between the culvert under State Highway Route 83 and Longview Meadow Lake.

Project evaluation:

1. The project will provide significant interjurisdictional benefits.
2. The project will provide flood hazard reduction benefits.
3. The project will provide structural damage reduction benefits to the residential properties and roads.
4. The project will improve water quality.
5. The project will provide benefits to natural resources as a result of enhanced water quality.
6. The project will provide some nuisance flood reduction benefits.
7. The project will provide multiple use benefits.
8. The use of Federal or State funding is not proposed.
9. Public education and outreach is not proposed.

This project ***IS RECOMMENDED*** for WMB funding in the amount of \$14,000 and 8 hours of SMC staff time.




**6. Lakeridge restoration association ADID wetland.** An application was submitted by the Lakeridge Restoration Association. The estimated project cost is \$14,500, of which \$5,500 is the applicant's share and \$9,000 is being requested from the WMB, with 10 SMC in-kind hours. The proposed project scope includes aggressively restoring the function (filtering, and infiltration) of the wetland by restoration of the nearly 15 acre site. Work will focus on replacing existing aggressive/invasive plant communities with a broader range of native species appropriate for the site.

Project evaluation:

1. The project will provide interjurisdictional benefits.
2. The project will provide some flood hazard reduction benefits.
3. The project will provide some structural damage reduction benefits.
4. The project will provide significant water quality benefits.
5. The project will provide significant natural resources benefits.
6. The project will provide some nuisance flooding reduction benefits.
7. The project will provide some multiple use benefits.
8. The use of Federal or State funding is not proposed.
9. Public education and outreach is not proposed.

This project ***IS RECOMMENDED*** for WMB funding in the amount of \$9,000 and 10 hours of SMC staff time.





**7. Shenandoah Lane Drainage Improvements.** An application was submitted by the Village of Long Grove. **The estimated project cost is \$262,016, of which \$ 212,016 is the applicant's share and \$50,000 is being requested from the WMB, with 8 SMC in-kind hours.** The proposed project scope includes a drainage improvement project that re-routes the storm sewer from the drainage structure on the east side of Shenandoah Lane, south to the side yard of 2546 Shenandoah Lane, east to Checker Road, and then a n in-kind replacement along Checker Road. The re-routing will include abandonment of the existing storm sewer in place. **Due to the scope and character of this project, it has been referred to SMC's Stormwater Infrastructure Repair Fund (SIRF) program and is recommended for SIRF funding (\$50,000).**

Project evaluation:

1. The project will provide interjurisdictional benefits.
2. The project will provide flood hazard reduction benefits.
3. The project will provide structural damage reduction benefits.
4. The project will provide water quality benefits.
5. The project will provide natural resources benefits.
6. The project will provide minor nuisance flooding reduction benefits.
7. The project will not provide multiple use benefits.
8. The use of Federal or State funding is not proposed.
9. Public education and outreach is not proposed.

This project ***IS NOT RECOMMENDED*** for WMB funding.
