Chuck Fagan – Lake County Deputy Undersheriff

## Proclamation

- WHEREAS,** Charles "Chuck" Fagan was the youngest of eight children. He graduated from North Chicago High School in 1967 and served in the United States Army from 1968 – 1970, including a tour of duty in Viet Nam; and
- WHEREAS,** Chuck began his career at the Lake County Sheriff's Office on July 17, 1972 as a certified Deputy Sheriff, and was originally assigned to the Jail and Communications Divisions. Chuck was eventually assigned to the Highway Patrol Division and then the Criminal Investigations Division. Chuck was a member of the first Tactical Response Team and Dive Team for the Lake County Sheriff's Office; and
- WHEREAS,** Chuck was promoted to the rank of Corporal in March 1985. Chuck continued his career in the Investigations Division and was promoted to the rank of Sergeant in December 1988. In 1991 Chuck returned to the Highway Patrol Division and then took charge of the Civil Process and Criminal Warrants Division. During that time he was also named as Commander of Operations for the Lake County Major Crime Task Force; and
- WHEREAS,** In July 1995 Chuck attended the FBI Academy in Quantico, Virginia. Chuck eventually returned to the Criminal Investigations Division and was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant in February 1996. In 1996 Chuck was also named the Commander of the Lake County Major Crime Task Force. Chuck retired from the Sheriff's Office in 1999 and went to work for the Ann Kiley Center, investigating the abuse and/or neglect of mentally challenged adults who reside at the facility; and
- WHEREAS,** Chuck retired from the Sheriff's Office in 1999 and went to work for the Ann Kiley Center, investigating the abuse and/or neglect of mentally challenged adults who reside at the facility. In December 2002 Chuck was appointed Chief of Police for the Village of Antioch, where he remained until 2006. In December 2006, newly elected Sheriff Mark Curran appointed Chuck to the position of Undersheriff, which he held until his retirement in November 2011; and
- WHEREAS,** to commemorate Chuck's commitment to law enforcement throughout Lake County Illinois and in recognition of Chuck's positive impact on the Village of Long Grove security through the Lake County Sherriff's Office

Now, Therefore I, Maria D. Rodriguez, President of the Village of Long Grove, Lake County, Illinois, along with the Board of Trustees, do hereby proclaim on behalf of its citizens, appreciation for Chuck Fagan for his service to the Residents of Long Grove.
